- History: 1 credit of World Hist/Geo, 1 credit of US Hist, 0.5 credits of VA Hist, and 0.5 credits of Gov.
- 4. Econ: 0.5 credits of Personal Finance and 0.5 credits of Economics.
- Bible: 1 HS or 0.5 dual credits for every year as a full-time LUOA student. DE Bible required
- 6. Health & PE: 2 credits including a minimum of 0.5 credits in each subject.
- Lang/FA/CTE: 2 credits of a lang, fine arts, or career & tech (no more than 1 credit of lang).<sup>8</sup>
- A min of 22 total credits plus 1 Bible credit for every year as a full-time LUOA student is required for grad.
