COURSE SYLLABUS

ARTS 342 Digital Imaging

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Creating multiple digital images through a varied methodology. Preparing digitized art for electronic media and the printed page through electronic pre-press techniques. Training in a professional image-editing application. (Formerly ARTS 351)

RATIONALE

Training in a professional image editing software application is crucial to the development of a graphic and media designer. The ability to create, manipulate, edit and create digital images from photos and other digital media is a required skillset for anyone entering these or related fields.

- A. Analyze various technical methodologies for creating digital images.
- B. Apply techniques for importing and digitizing images.
- C. Create effective, high quality illustrations and photos.
- D. Evaluate various forms of digital imagery created for artistic expression.

V. COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS

- A. Textbook readings and lecture presentations/notes

After reading the Syllabus and <u>Student Expectations</u>, the student will complete the related checklist found in Module/Week 1.

- C. Discussion Board Forums (5)
 - 1. Discussion boards are collaborative learning experiences. Therefore, in Discussion Board Forums 1, 2, 4, and 5, the student will create a small PDF version of each of the images for each of the 4 projects. The student will post them to the threads for the listed Discussion Board Forums. The student will then choose 2 other members of his/her group and give constructive criticism for those individuals' work. Criteria will be given for feedback. The student will then respond to someone who has critiqued his/her pieces.
 - 2. In Discussion Board Forum 3, the student will watch the videos from the links supplied. The student will then respond to the videos according the posted information, and to 2 other threads.
- D. Assignments (4)

Most assignments will help the student develop practical, technical skills based mostly upon instructions from chapters in the text. The student will finish with a composition or "mini-project" which will be digitally submitted and evaluated along with 2 short writing assignments.

E. Photo Essay

This is the first of a group of 4 major projects in this course. The student will produce a series of 3 photographs original to him/her. The photos will be processed in various ways in order to reflect a chosen theme. The images will be produced in Photoshop and delivered in the native Photoshop format.

F. Movie Story

This assignment will be a short paper giving the story plot and primary characters of a Christian Science Fiction/Fantasy Story. The paper will be delivered in electronic format in Microsoft Word.

G. Expressive Painting

This is the second of a group of 4 major projects in the course. The student will utilize an original photograph and produce a digital painting in Photoshop using the photograph as a visual reference. The digital painting will be delivered in the native Photoshop format.

H. SciFi Poster

The third project is a poster design. The student will imagine that the story written about in the Movie Story Assignment is made into a feature length film. What would the marquee poster look like? The student is to do all necessary photography for the poster. Illustrations, textures, and other imagery will be originally done by the student. Delivery will be in Photoshop in digital format.

I. Final Proposal

This assignment will be a short paper giving the details of a project that the student would like to do for the Final Project. This project should expand and enhance the skill set which the student has learned during the semester. The paper will be delivered in Microsoft Word.

J. Final Project

The final project will be a work designed and chosen by the student with the approval of the instructor. The proposal will be reviewed by the instructor. Several suggested directions will be listed. Original ideas will be considered. Delivery will be electronic in Photoshop.
