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### **BIBL 104**

#### **SURVEY OF OLD AND NEW TESTAMENT**

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This survey course is designed to lay a foundational understanding of Scripture via a historical survey of the Old and New Testaments. The student will engage a range of learning activities related to the issues interacting with biblical literature, basic hermeneutical principles, key themes and persons of the canon, and the redemptive theme of Scripture.

#### **RATIONALE**

The course's motivation is a combination of both edifying and equipping students. In other words, this course is designed to teach students to "fish," as it were, so that in their future walk with God, they might be able to discern the key theme(s) of Scripture for themselves, therefore making their own Bible study more effective and increasing their utility in being able to convey the story and universal truths of Scripture to others.

- B. Identify the message and leading theological emphasis of the Old and New Testaments.
- C. Describe the different characters, main ideas, and types of genres typically seen in the Old and New Testaments.
- D. Apply basic hermeneutical principles to his or her own study of biblical literature.
- E. Evaluate the redemptive theme of Scripture ultimately fulfilled through the person, ministry, sacrifice, resurrection, and return of Jesus Christ.

- C. Discussion Board Forums (4)  
Discussion boards are collaborative learning experiences. Therefore, the student will create a thread in response to the provided prompt for each forum. Each thread must be at least 400 words and demonstrate course-related knowledge. In addition to the thread, the student is required to reply to at least 2 other classmates' threads. Each reply must be at least 100 words. The student must support assertions with references as needed. (MLO: A, B, C, D, & E)
- D. Old Testament Character Sketch Bible Study  
The student will study the life of one of the characters from *Courageous Faith*. He or she will seek to discover what can be learned from the selected character when he or she purposefully studies the character's life using the technique of observation, interpretation, correlation, and application. Rather than using the typical research paper format, this character sketch Bible study will be completed by using a template developed from Chapter 36 of *Everyday Bible Study*. (MLO: A, B, C, D, & E)
- E. Quizzes (8)  
Each quiz will cover the Reading & Study material for the module/week in which it is assigned. Each quiz will be open-book/open-notes, contain 25–50 multiple-choice and true/false questions, and have a 1-hour and 30-minute time limit. (MLO: A, B, C, D, & E)
