COURSE SYLLABUS

CHPL 598

SPIRITUAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHAPLAIN

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course addresses the professional and spiritual formation of chaplains. Students will observe and evaluate, first-hand, various chaplain ministries. Attention is given to the biblical nature of chaplain ministry and its practical application within the secular and pluralistic contexts of the military, healthcare, and community chaplain settings. Special emphasis is given to formation of godly character necessary for successful chaplain ministry.

RATIONALE

Chaplains need to understand the biblical nature of chaplain ministry and its application within secular and pluralistic contexts. The student needs to observe and evaluate first-hand various chaplain ministries to best understand how to provide soul-care and lead spiritually within the framework of secular, pluralistic environments. Additionally, the chaplain must be spiritually grounded and growing in the Lord to minister within military, healthcare, and community chaplain settings.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Appraise the biblical nature and work of chaplaincy within military, healthcare, and community settings.
- B. Assess the value of chaplain ministry as observed firsthand in pluralistic chaplaincy contexts.
- C. Create a chaplain/ministry manual for a specified type of chaplaincy ministry.
- D. Summarize the biblical basis for spiritual disciplines and daily living.

- E. Analyze the disciplines essential for a strong spiritual formation.
- F. Critique the evidence of spiritual disciplines in his/her life.
- G. Create a spiritual growth plan pertinent for a specified type of chaplaincy ministry.

V. COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND ASSIGNMENTS

After reading the Course Syllabus and <u>Student Expectations</u>, the student will complete the related checklist found in Module/Week 1.

C. Discussion Board Forums (4)

Discussion boards are collaborative learning experiences. Therefore, the student is required to create a thread in response to the provided prompt for each forum. Each thread must be a minimum of 400 words and demonstrate course-related knowledge. In addition to the thread, the student is required to reply to 2 other classmates' threads. Each reply must be a minimum of 200 words.

D. Journals (14)

The student will write Journals recounting his/her ministry observations and spiritual reflections. Prompts for each journal will be provided.

E. Course Plan of Action

The student will disclose the 3 chaplains he/she will interview. Additionally, the student will list the 6 services they will use for their ministry manual excerpts. Finally, the student will name the chaplain he/she will shadow and provide a schedule regarding how he/she will fulfill the 16-hour requirement.

F. Spiritual Assessment

The student will complete a personal Spiritual Assessment as the basis for a spiritual development plan. The student will reflect intently on his/her daily relationship with the Lord and complete a personal SWOT analysis. The Spiritual Assessment paper must be 900–1,200 words.

G. Spiritual Development Plan

The student will create a Spiritual Development Plan. Each Spiritual Development Plan will focus on specific and measureable steps the student will take over the coming weeks to implement/practice chosen spiritual disciplines. Creating a Spiritual Development Plan is intentionally mapping the student's part of the spiritual formation process. The Spiritual Development Plan must be a minimum of 3,000 words and be in current Turabian format. H. Shadow Evaluations (8)

The student will evaluate his/her shadow experience. This will include an evaluation from the chaplain shadowed and their affirmation regarding the completion of the 16 hours required. Each evaluation must be 600–900 words.

I. Chaplain Manual Excerpts (6)

The student will create ministry framework tools for common ministrations. The excerpts will be based on predefined areas listed within the course. Each excerpt must be 300–1,500 words.

J. Journal Summary

The final journal will be a summary of the student's ministry experience and spiritual growth for the entirety of his/her formation practicum. The Journal Summary must be 900–1,200 words.
