#### ADVANCED EVALUATION STRATEGIES FOR NURSE EDUCATORS

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

In this course an overview of theories on educational measurement and evaluation is provided. Methods of evaluating teaching effectiveness, student learning, and student performance are explored with emphasis on test construction and analysis.

#### **RATIONALE**

This course is designed to prepare the nurse educator with advanced assessment and evaluation strategies for use in education. The nurse educator will be equipped to write test items, analyze test items, and will be knowledgeable in special interests related to testing and other methods of evaluation.

C. Discussion Board Forums (3)

Discussion boards are collaborative learning experiences. Therefore, the student is required to provide a thread in response to the provided topic for each forum. Each thread does not have a required word count. However, it will be graded on course-related knowledge, including depth and breadth of discussion. In addition to the thread, the student is required to reply to 2 other classmates' threads. Graduate-level writing in current APA format (excluding the cover page) is expected. Two peer-reviewed journal articles must be referenced for each thread, and 1 different peer-reviewed journal article must be referenced for each reply.

D. Written Assignments (5)

The student will compose written assessments in current APA format that focus on learning objectives, item writing, appraising the item varieties, developing a rubric, and assessment of clinical learning.

E. Test Administration Paper

The student will write a 5–10-page research-based paper in current APA format that focuses on test administration, analysis, and review.

F. Personal Philosophy of Grading Paper

The student will write a 5–10-page research-based paper in current APA format that focuses on his/her personal philosophy of grading.

G. Clinical Evaluation Tool

The student will develop a clinical evaluation tool using the NCLEX and nursing process as cross-reference. It must be 1–2 pages in current APA format.

# H. Quizzes

Each quiz will cover the Reading & Study material for the assigned modules/weeks. Each quiz will be open-book/open-notes, contain 15 multiple-choice questions, and have a 1-hour time limit.
